Provide <u>adequate instructional materials, texts, and library services</u> which reflect the cultural diversity and pluralistic nature of American society.	Standard H	
Have on file a <u>written, long-range plan for library services development</u> which has been formulated by teachers, library and audiovisual personnel and administrators, and <u>approved by the school district board</u> . The plan must <u>establish clear goals</u> and a <u>realistic strategy</u> for using telecommunications and information technology to improve education or library services;	E-Rate (priority 2)	
The plan must have a <u>professional development strategy</u> to ensure that staff know how to use these new technologies to improve education or library services;	E-Rate (priority 2)	
The plan must include an <u>assessment</u> of the telecommunication services, hardware, software, and other services that will be needed to improve education or library services; and	E-Rate (priority 2)	
The plan must include an <u>evaluation process</u> that enables the school or library <u>to monitor progress</u> toward the specified goals and make mid-course corrections in response to new developments and opportunities and they arise.	E-Rate (priority 2)
